

Annual Report Stichting Chagpori for Tibetan Medicines (SCTG)

Amsterdam 2021

Just like last year, 2021 was a year full of limitations and everything that these can bring.

The covid pandemic created many obstacles in India as well.

Due to the isolated location of the college the students were able continue their studies. Unfortunately, only four new students could actually enroll in March, due to the limitations on traveling and meeting together. These students did their oral and written exams in November and December.

The senior students did their practical training in the pharmacy and also in different clinics.

Yangsi Trogawa Rinpoche had to leave the monastery for some months due to the pandemic and went back home in Darjeeling. Luckily, he could continue his studies online and his study is progressing well.

Sponsor activities in Holland

We had a strict lockdown for most of the year which, for the board, resulted in communication mainly via phone and email.

In December we could send out our annual letter, which is also on the website www.sctg.nl

This year we received around 25.656 euros of donations for new construction of the hostel in Salugara and the setting up of the hospital room. (It's a pity that the construction couldn't start until now, due to the pandemic.)

This includes 7,000 euros from the Rigzin Foundation, 2,000 euros from a legacy, 12,000 euros from the Yangchen Drolma Fund, and an extra donation of 1,000 euros.

The Rigzin Foundation also sponsored 1,500 for Corona help. Due to this, the Institute could give free medical camps in the rural areas and support needy people with food packets.

The Chagpori donation box in Nel's clinic collected 2,050 euros; this money can be used for extra expenses.

The sponsoring of the students totaled 15,280 euros.

The sponsoring of 750 euros towards the salary of a clinic doctor could continue, too.

We received 1,656 euros for Yangsi's education.

Altogether we have raised 46,402 euros and have transferred 46,301 of that to Darjeeling.

Our website and the CTMI website are still maintained by a patient of Nel's.

Again, this was a year during which none of the board could visit Darjeeling, nor could people from Darjeeling visit Holland. Fortunately, we could stay in touch with each other through the internet.

We are looking forward to a time when the situation will ease and we can all meet up again.
