

Annual Report Stichting Chagpori for Tibetan Medicines (SCTG),  
Amsterdam 2022

Looking back at 2022 one of the highlights was the visit to Chagpori Darjeeling by amchi Nel de Jong. It was great to see how Chagpori people were doing!

Meeting up with friends, Board-members, students, doctors and everyone involved worked out very well.

It is promising to see the make-up in the pharmacy. The production is clean, good quality, and hygienic according to the prescribed requirements.

At the moment there are 14 students and they are doing very well.

The admission of the students is set by the Ayush Foundation. As soon as Chagpori fulfils the requirements set by the Ayush there can be an inflow of 15 students each year.

At the moment the biggest obstacle for these requirements is the affiliation with the Calcutta University, discussions on this are continuing.

The other obstacle is the housing of the students. For this the Institute still has to construct more hostel facilities. And hopefully the Institute will be able to do so in the near future in Salugara.

Then the College will be also able to shift in the near future to the pharmacy compound in Sallugara.

In Holland we are very grateful towards the people who continue to support the study of the students. Besides that, we see people contribute towards the maintenance and construction of the buildings and some towards the clinics and the salary of clinic doctors.

Mainly due to the corona restrictions and the after-effects we had no visiting doctors from Darjeeling in the Netherlands.
